A Bill in Support of the Electrochemical Society (ECS)

WHEREAS, the Electrochemical Society (ECS) was founded in 1902 as an international nonprofit, educational organization dedicated to advancing the theory and practice of electrochemistry; and,

WHEREAS, electrochemistry is the study of fuel cells and batteries that would serve as alternative sources of energy; and,

WHEREAS, ECS at Berkeley currently consists of 16 members, including graduates and undergraduates; and,

WHEREAS, recruitment is geared toward students enrolled in energy courses and partaking in growth efforts, and publicity will be conducted via flyering and tabling at high-profile events such as research poster sessions; and,

WHEREAS, UC Berkeley currently leads a \$500 million energy research consortium, in partnership with the Lawrence Berkeley National Lab and the University of Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, ECS bridges the gaps among academia, research, and engineering to bring people together from around the world for the exchange of technical information; and,

WHEREAS, ECS offers events such as company tours, campus-wide lunch meetings to gather researchers of electrochemical systems for collaboration, and a battery class taught by a group member available to all Cal students; and,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Electrochemical Society at Berkeley be recognized by the ASUC as a first-year Student Activity Group (SAG).

A Bill in Support of Alice Sun

WHEREAS, Alice Sun is the only Chinese speaking clinician at University Health Services (UHS) at the University of California, Berkeley; and,

WHEREAS, Alice Sun has been a Nurse Practitioner at UHS for 13 years; and,

WHEREAS, Alice Sun is currently struggling with being laid-off by UHS; and,

WHEREAS, UHS provides services for students in both mild and severe conditions; and

WHEREAS, it is much easier for students who are native Chinese speakers to communicate specific medical terms and symptoms in Chinese; and,

WHEREAS, such communication can be vital to UHS treatment and the ensuing student's health; and,

WHEREAS, Alice Sun has a strong understanding of the health care system in China, including traditional Chinese medicine practices, and knows how to integrate traditional remedies with sound Western medicine theory; and,

WHEREAS, Alice Sun's work has been a real benefit to the Chinese community at UC Berkeley; and,

WHEREAS, the Chinese community that receives help from Alice Sun ranges from undergraduate students, graduate students, exchange students, concurrent enrollment students, to visiting scholars, researchers and more; and,

WHEREAS, about half of Berkeley's Asian students are of Chinese ancestry; and,

WHEREAS, 513 students enrolled at Berkeley in Fall 2009 as international students directly from China; and,

WHEREAS, the Associated Students of the University of California (ASUC) is committed to the welfare of all students and recognizes the importance and value of Alice Sun's presence at UHS; and,

WHEREAS, this bill is endorsed by wide ranging members of the Chinese community at UC Berkeley, including Xuan Fan, Chunhui Gu, Hao Shen, Liang, Mo Mei Chen, Qing Tao Chen, and Minxuan He,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the ASUC supports Alice Sun's continued work at UHS; and,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the President of the ASUC writes letters to Claudia Covello, Brad Buchman and Jo Billington, who are the Executive Director, Medical Director and Clinical Services Director of UHS, respectively, to reflect the position of the ASUC on this issue.
