WHEREAS, the Undergraduate Journal of Psychology at Berkeley (UJPB) is a third year ASUC-sponsored publication that allows undergraduate students to disseminate their research studies to the campus at large; and,

WHEREAS, the UC Berkeley Psi Chi Chapter is a fourth year ASUC-sponsored Student Activity Group and is an honor society with the purpose of encouraging and maintaining excellence in scholarship of the members of the field of psychology; and,

WHEREAS, the Association of Psychology Undergraduates (APU) is a fourteenth year ASUC-sponsored Student Activity Group and is the liaison between students and the UC Berkeley Psychology Department; and,

WHEREAS, these aforementioned groups feel that there is currently no space for psychologists to come together and showcase their work; and,

WHEREAS, these aforementioned groups took the initiative to come together and host a conference to allow undergraduate students who have completed scientific studies in psychology to disseminate their findings to the scholarly community at large, thereby promoting excellence in and encouraging further undergraduate research in psychology; and,

WHEREAS, the first annual conference will be held on the UC Berkeley campus; and,

WHEREAS, there will be approximately 80 undergraduate research presenters and over 200 student/faculty attendees; and,

WHEREAS, over 300 colleges across the nation have been invited to this conference on May 8, 2010, including 9 University of California campuses and 23 California State Universities; and,

WHEREAS, each participating student organization does not have the budgetary flexibility to allocate funds to this conference; and,

A Bill in support of Inside the Living Room

WHEREAS, ILR is a comprehensive internship program (recognized by CLL) and organized student group composed of four director positions (Student Director, Dir. Of Admin. And Fin., Dir. Of Public Rel. and Marketing, Dir. Of Professional Dev.) 20 interns (UC Berkeley undergraduate and graduate student) and supporters (faculty, Cal Corps staff, EBSC immigrant and partners, and other UC Berkeley students).

WHEREAS, ILR student interns provide over 60 hours a week of legal and social services to immigrants and refugees (mostly from Latin America and Haiti) at East Bay Sanctuary Covenant (EBSC), a 501(c)3 nonprofit.

WHEREAS, ILR also provides academic and professional development workshops open to the public at our own cost including a Career Planning workshop, Grant Writing Workshop, Asylum workshop with guest speakers (attorney and refugee), and one currently to be held on Tuesday: Student Panel on Current Issues in Latin America with two graduate students, and two interns.

WHEREAS, ILR has no source of funding, grants, or revenue and must pay out of pocket for its services (printing costs, fund raising for the Sanctuary, recruitment, rooms scheduling, etc.).

WHEREAS, The ILR has incurred the following costs:
